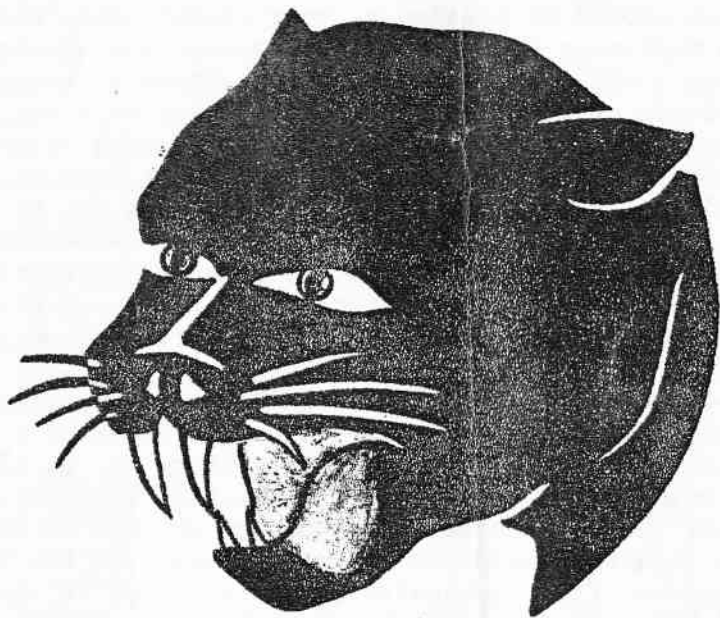

CLUB NOTES.

Firstly I want to remind boys of the rules around our club and their obligations to their club.

1. We do not allow boys under 16 to smoke at the club or at games.

2. We do not allow swearing. We expect adults, parents, coaches and managers to back us in this. Just because it is 1988 does not mean we should close our eyes to offensive things. T.V. does not help in this regard and I will continue to chastise any boy I hear using gutter language. I admit I am tempted to kick a bottom here and there

3. The club should be treated as your second home. Possibly some boys make a real mess there, too, but because Mum cleans up after you, does not mean I will. This applies in the dressing rooms and outside. There are plenty of rubbish bins to use. Every Saturday morning I clean the dressing rooms to make them fit for you and visitors to use and when you finish I clean them again. I should not have to, if you had pride you would not make the mess. Even birds know not to mess up their own nests.

4. Cut out throwing stones. Somebody is going to walk into one and maybe lose an eye. As well a lot of stones find their way onto your football fields and imagine the bruises if you were tackled onto one.

Team coaches--especially AUSSIE FOOTY coaches. Are you rotating boys in different positions to give them experience? I remember a boy who always played fullback from 9's to 17's. Then there was no place to go because he knew nothing else and there was a better fullback.

In Aussie Footy the rules state boys must be changed so that all can say that at some time they have played everywhere. You are not helping your boys to progress if you concentrate your top boys in key positions all the time and hide the rest. And the reason we do not print scores is to take the emphasis off winning so it is not a good thing if you do not encourage this outlook. I know it can be frustrating but you are not playing for a premiership and you are supposed to be developing boys. A boy will gain confidence if you give him a chance to do something constructive.

One thing we can excuse is a bit of heat in the game, body contact sport will bring that out occasionally. We do not condone it but we can understand it (this is not permission to look for trouble). But there is no room for going on after the final bell, and remember you are still under control of the umpire while you are on the field and can be reported. If you watch fighters slogging at each other, they drop their hands at the sound of the bell and walk away. You are expected to do the same or your game is no longer sport

We need some boys for the 15's. We have barely enough and are in danger of losing a couple.
